Groundwater Availability and Use in the Dry Zone of Sri Lanka

Background to the symposium

Use of groundwater for agriculture and domestic purposes has been an age old practice in Sri Lanka. However, owing to many reasons, it is a challenge at present to manage groundwater in a sustainable manner while striking the right balance between availability and demand.

Lack of understanding on the availability, demand and vulnerability are continued to be the major issues at all levels from farmers to policy makers.

Objective of this symposium is to disseminate the knowledge generated on the availability and use of groundwater in the dry one of Sri Lanka where the resource is being increasingly exploited in a haphazard manner.

The symposium will include a comprehensive panel discussion aiming at producing a much needed policy document.

It aims to attract students, researchers, managers, administrators, and policy makers, and provide them a forum to discuss issues pertinent to sustainable management of groundwater in the dry zone of Sri Lanka.
